BOARD OF ALDERMEN, for the City of Hopkins, met at the Clerk's Office in adjourned session, June, 8th, 1914.

Board meet for the purpose of considering the matter of passing an Ordinance, declaring the result of an election held on Monday the first, day of June, 1914 for the purpose of voting on a proposition to approve a contract entered into between said City of Hopkins and H.A.Dalby, for the purpose of lighting said City by electric lights for Ten years, and to become indebted in the sum of Six-Hundred and Six Dollars, per annum for ten years in addition to the annual income and revenue of said City to pay for said lights.

Motion made and seconded, that this Ordinance be placed on its First reading this motion prevailed and it was read a first time.

Motion made and seconded, that the Ordinance, be read a Second time, this motion prevailed and it was read a second time,

Motion made and seconded that this Ordinance be read a third time and placed on its final passage, this motion prevailed and it was read a third time.

Mayor Donlin, then put the question " Shall this Ordinance be passed:-- and the Vote was taken as follows:--

There was submitted an Ordinance, declaring the result of an Election, held on the First day of June, 1914, for the purpose of voting on the Proposition to authorize the Board of Aldermen to grant to H. A. Dalby his successors and assigns, an electric light franchise.

Motion made and seconded, that this Ordinance be placed on its First reading, this motion prevailed and it was read a first time.

Motion made and seconded, that this Ordinance be read a third time and placed on its final passage, This motion prevailed and it was read a third time.
