The City Att'y then offered A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE, Levying the Poll Tax in the City of Hopkins, for the year 1916.

On motion made, and seconded that this ordinance, be placed upon its First reading, this motion prevailed and it was read as follows.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Hopkins, as follows:

All male persons the age of Twenty-One and Fifty Years, who have resided in the corporate limits of the City of Hopkins, for Thirty days prior to passage of this Act, are hereby required to work on the streets and alleys, of said City Two days, for the year 1916, or in lieu thereof, to pay to the Street Commissioner, the sum of Two-Dollars, (\$2.00) and if said work is not done at the time and place at and for which notice is given by the Street Commissioner, the said Two-Dollars, shall become immediately due, and payable, and suit shall be brought for the Collection thereof according to law, and the City attorney shall be allowed a fee of Five Dollars for bringing such suit, which fee shall be taxed as costs against the defendant, in such suit against whom judgment is rendered.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

The City Attorney, also offered an ordinance, levying the rate of taxes for the Year 1916.

On motion made and seconded that this ordinance be placed upon its first reading, this motion prevailed, and it was read as follows:-

Be it ordained by the Board of Alderman, of the City of Hopkins as follows.:

Section, -1 There is levied for the year 1916, a tax of Twenty-Five Ct.s on the One-Hundred Dollars Valuation, on all taxable property in the City of Hopkins for general purposes; and

There is hereby levied for the Year 1916, a tax of Eighty-Five Cents, on the One Hundred Dollars Valuation, on all taxable property, in the City of Hopkins for the purpose of paying the interest, and bonds, for building the City Water-works, "and-

There is hereby levied for the Year 1916, a tax of Twenty-Five cents on the One Hundred Dollars Valuation, on all taxable property, in the City of Hopkins, for the purpose of paying for lighting the City of Hopkins.

This ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Motion made and seconded That this ordinance be placed upon its second reading, this motion prevailed, and it was read a second time.

Motion made and seconded That this ordinance be read a third time and put upon its final passage, this Motion prevailed and it was read a third time.

Mayor Donlin, then put the question. Shall this ordinance be passed, and the Vote of the Aldermen was taken. to-wit,:
