On motion it was ordered that the Trustees, of Xenia Lodge (50) A.F.&.A.M. be Notified to repair their side-walk from the Hall entrance, east to Third Street.

Petition of Jackson Sherry & Co, requesting Permission, to Cross Roseberry . and Rail-road Streets, with a switch from the railroad begining at a point opposite due west of the O.Lewis Restaurent runing south according to the survey, and cross the said streets, where the block-Iron building now stands, belonging to Sayler Hardware Co.

The Switch is for private use, only. and will be used for cars, loaded with Lumber, Coal.Cement, Lime, Impliments. and other Merchandise. for Jackson Sherry & Co and Sayler Hardware, Co. and they agree to keep the Streets open at all times only When cars are handled by the Rail Road Company.

Their request, was on motion ordered laid over, until next meeting to give the board more time to investigate and examine the proposed side-track.

No further business Board did adjourn.

ORDINANCE, NO (75)

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE, Leveying the Poll Tax in the City of Hopkins for the year 1917.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen Of the City of Hopkins as follows,-:

All male persons between the ages of Twenty-One, and Fifty Years, who have resided within the corporate limits of the City of Hopkins Mo for Thirty days before the passage of this act are hereby required to work on the Streets and Alleys, of said City, Two days for the Year 1917, or in lieu thereof to pay to the Street Commissioner of said City the Sum of Two-Dollars, and if said work is not done at the time and place, at and for which Notice is given by the Street Com, said Two-Dollars shall immediately become due and payable, and suit shall be brougnt for the collection thereof, according to law and the City Attorney, shall be allowed a fee of Five Dollars for bringing such suit, which fee shall be taxed as costs against the defendent in such suit against whom judgment is rendered.

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.
