This statement was carefully examined, in each detail by the Board, when on motion, made and Seconed, that his report be accepted and allthings be approved, this motion prevailed, When on motion it was ordered that Warrents be drawn on the City Treasurer, as follows,-:

There was presented before the Board, A Bill for an Ordinance prohibiting the throwing , -dumping, -putting or deposing, any Ashes, -dirt, -earth, -manure, -rubbish or waste material on any Oiled street in the City of Hopkins, and prohibiting the starting or building any fire or burning any thing whatsoever, on such oiled streets, and providing penalties therefor,-: Motion made and Seconed that this Ordinance be paced upon its First reading,- This motion prevailed and it was read the First time as follows.-

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermer of the City of Hopkins Missouri as follows,-:

Section,-.1. It is hereby declared to be unlawful for any person to throw, -dump, -put or deposit any Ashes, -dirt, -earth, -manure, -rubbish, or waste material, including fruits, -vegitable or melons or any parts thereof, or to start or build a fire upon any such oiled street or alley, whether upon the part of such oiled street which is oil or not,.

Section,-.2.- Any person found guilty of violateing any provisions of Section,-One, hereof shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and fined in a sum not exceeding, Twenty-Five Dollars, for each such offence.

Section,-.3.- This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage. and approveal.

Motion made and Seconed that this Ordinance be read a Seconed time, this motion prevailed and it was read a Seconed time.

Motion made and Seconed, that this Ordinance be read a Third time and put upon its final passage, this motion prevailed and it was read a third time.
