

SECTION,-3. Whenever a person oprating a Motor Vehicle, shall meet in the streets or Alleys, of said City any other person ridding or driving a horse or hoses or other animal, or any other vehicle, the person so operating such motor vehicle shall reasonably, turn the same to the right of the center of such street or alley, so as to pass without interference, When any such person so operating a Motor Vehicle, shall overtake any such horse. animal or other vehicle, the rider or driver of such other horse animal, or vehicle shall as soon as practical turn aside to the right so as to allow free passage on the left hand side, Any such person so operating a Motor vehicle shall at the intersections of streets or Alleys keep to the right of the intersections of the center of such street or alleys, when turning to the right and pass to the right of such inter-section when turning to the left.

SECTION,-4. Wherever said City has or shall caused to be placed at the intersections, of streets in said City, any mark,-tile or monument or sign, of any kind, it shall be the duty, of any person passing or turning around such mark-tile or monument, or sign, to keep to the right of such mark,-tile-monument or sign.

SECTION,- 5. It shall be unlawful for any person, operating or driving a motor vehicle on Barnard Street within Two Blocks east of Third-Street or on Third-Street, within Two Blocks south of Barnard Street, to turn such motor vehicle at any place on said street-except, at the intersection of the street and only by passing to the right, of the mark, tile, monuments or signs, placed at the intersections of such streets, and on passing or driving along said streets mentioned in this section, every person operating or driving a motor vehicle, shall keep to the right of the center of such streets, or when cars are parked, in the center of said street all motor vehicles shall be driven to the right of the cars so parked.

SECTION,- 6. Any person found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this Ordinance, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five-(5.00)Dollars nor more than Fifty(50.00)Dollars.

SECTION,- 7. All Ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION,- 8. This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

On motion made,-Seconed,-Put,-and declared carried, ~~###it was read a second time~~ This motion prevailed and it was read a second time.

Motion made,-Seconed,-Put,-and declared, that this Ordinance be read a Third-time, and put upon its final passage, This motion prevailed and it was read a third time,

Mayor,-Mutti, then put the question, Shall this ordinance be passed, and the names of each Alderme was called as follows,-

E. E. Pike,-Yea,-P. W. Shafer,-Yea,-Oliver. Lewis,-Yea,-E. A. Miller, Yea.

Mayor, Mutti, then declared the Ordinance Passed, and forthwith, returned it with his approval endorsed thereon, and the same was attested by the City Clerk, and the Seal of said City affixed thereto, dated this the 10th, day of June, 1920. and the Clerk was instructed to place a true copy of the same upon the City Records, and it shall be known as Ordinance No(147) and found recorded on Pages(147.&.148) of the City records.

There was presented and read a First-Time, a Bill forean Ordinance Levying a License Tax, On Motor-Vehicles, as follows,-

Be it Ordained by the board of Aldermanof the City of Hopkins Missouri as follows.-:

SECTION,- 1. There# is hereby levied a License tax upon each and evry moter vehicle, the owner of which resides within the coroporate limits of said City of Hopkins an amount in accordance with the following schedule of Horse-Power rateings,-:

Moter Cycle	\$ 1.00
Less than Twelve-Horse-Power,	2.00
Twelve Horse-Power or more,	3.00

SECTION,- 2. The Horse-Power of said Motor Vehicles, shall be computed as per paragraph,-7.-of Section,-5. of an Act entitled, " Motor Vehicles," as the same appears in the Laws of Missouri,-1919 -Page, 533.

SECTION,- 3. Said license shall become due, and payable on the First day of July, 1920,- and shall be good and in effect until the First day, of February 1921. and -Seven-Twelvths, of above stated amounts, shall be paid on each motor vehicle owned by persons residing within the copporate limits of said city for said term ending February,-1st, 1921 and that on and after February, 1st 1921 such license shall be due on the 1st, day of February ~~on~~ each

year and shall be good and effect until February, 1st of the following year.

SECTION,-4. If the application for such license, of a Motor vehicle, in said City is made during the period begining on the First day of August, and ending on the last day of October, One half of the annual license shall be paid. If the application is made during the period begining on the First day of November and ending on the last day of January, One fourth of the annual license shall be paid.

SECTION,-5. All such licenses shall be issued by the City tax Collector, of said City, on the payment by such resedent Motor vehicle owner of the amount due as shown by section -One hereof,

SECTION,-6. It shall be unlawful for any resident of the City of Hopkins to own a Motor vehicle without paying the license tax thereon as provided by this Ordinance.

SECTION,-7. When any motor vehicle on which such City license shall have been paid, shall be sold or transfered to another resedent of the City of Hopkins, said license may be transfered to another resedent of the City of Hopkins said license may be transfered on the order of such vender to the City Tax Collector of said City and the payment of 15 cents to him as a fee for making such transfer.

SECTION,-8. Said City Collector shall keep a record of all license issued, with the number of the license, Name of owner to whom issued and number of Car for which issued, and shall issue a license tag to such person, which tag shall be attached to said Motor vehicle, where plainly visible, and said tags shall be furnished by said City.

SECTION,-9. Where Motor vehicles are kept or housed out of the City and used exclusively for farming purposes and not as pleasure or business cars by resedents of said City in said City, though owned by resedents of said City, no license tax shall be required.

SECTION,-10. Each person or firm engaged as a dealer or dealers in Motor Vehicles in the City of Hopkins shall pay a license tax of Three-Dollars(3.00) which tax shall be paid at the same time and for the same period as other license taxes for Motor Vehicles.

SECTION,-11. Any person residing within the City of Hopkins who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and fined in a sum not less than Five-Dollars nor more than Twenty-Five Dollars.

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Motion made and Seconed, that this Ordinance be read a Seconed time, this motion prevailed and it was read a Seconed time.

Motion made an Seconed that this Ordinance be read a third time and placed upon its final passage, this motion prevailed and it was read a third time.

Mavor Mutti then put the question, Shall this Ordinance be Passed, and the names of each Aldermen was called as follows.-

Mayor, Mutti, Then declared the Ordinance passed, and forthwith, returned it with his approval endorced thereon, and the same was attested by the City Clerk and the Seal of said City affixed thereto, dated this the 10th, day of June, 1920. and the Clerk was instructed to place a true copy of said ordinance upon the City records, and it shall be known as ORDINANCE, NO,-(92) and is found recorded on Page,149. of the City records.

Now comes Wm. Applegate, acting Sexton and Enginer of the water Plant asking for an advance in his salary, from \$50.00 to \$ 75.00 the same to take effect begining May, 1st/1920. When on motion it was ordered that a committee, of Ald,-Miller and Lewis, confer with Mr Applegate# the proposition, to allow him a salary of \$ 65.00 for the month of May, and fix his salary begining with June, at \$ 75.00 per month thereafter, subject to the pleasure of the Board

Board then took the matter of re-oiling the streets, as provided in Ordinances, No's (84.-85.-& 86) passed and approved, Sept, 12th 1919. when there was read a communication to Mayor Mutti, from the Standard Oil CO, stating that they could furnish three cars, giving price per gallon, F.O.B. their Oil delivery station, with estimate of freight rates to Hopkins, said oil to be good road oil, and of the same quality used last year, when on motion it was ordered that the Mayor be authorized to place an order for one car to be delivered as soon as the necessary oil spreader can be made ready to spread said oil, and to have more cars if needed to follow subject to the pleasure of the board. The Mayor then advised that the -Street and Alley Committee, should cause all streets in oiling districts No's (1,-2,-& 3) to be made ready to receive the oil.
