

BOARD OF ALDERMEN,-

Met at the Clerk's Office in adjourn session for the purpose of passing an ordinance fixing the rate of levy of tax for the City for the year 1921. also fixing the amount of Poll-Tax to be paid for the year 1921. - *May 13-1921*

There was submitted to the board, by the City Att'ny a Bill for an Ordinance, to levy the Taxes for the City of Hopkins for the year 1921, when on motion, made and seconded the said bill for an ordinance be placed on its first reading, this Motion prevailed, and it was read as follows.-:

A Bill for an Ordinance to Levy the Tax for the City of Hopkins for the Year 1921.

Be it ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Hopkins as follows:-

There is hereby levied for the year 1921, a tax of Twenty, cents, on the One Hundred Dollar Valuation, on all Taxable property in the City of Hopkins, for general purposes, - and,-

There is hereby levied for the year 1921 a tax of - Thirty-Five cents On the One Hundred Dollar valuation on all taxable property in the City of Hopkins, for the purposes of paying the interest, and bonds for the City Waterworks, and:-

There is hereby Levied for the year 1921, a tax of - Fifteen Cents, on the One Hundred Dollar valuation on all Taxable property in the City of Hopkins, for the purpose of lighting the city of Hopkins.

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Motion made and seconded that this ordinance be read a second time this motion prevailed and it was read a second time,-

Motion made and Seconded that this Ordinance be read a Third Time and placed upon its final passage, This motion prevailed, and it was read a Third time,

Mayor Mutti, then Put the Question, Shall this ordinance be passed, and the names of each aldermen was called as follows.-:

Mayor Mutti, Then declared the Ordinance Passed, and forthwith returned it with his approval, endorsed thereon, and the same attested by the City Clerk, and the Seal of said City affixed thereto, dated this the 13th, day of May 1921. and instructed the Clerk to place upon the City Records a true Copy of said Ordinance, and it shall be known as Ordinance NO, -97, - and is found recorded on Page- 172 of City Records.

There was submitted by the City Attn'y A bill for an Ordinance Levying the Poll-Tax, in the City of Hopkins, for the year 1921.

Be it Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Hopkns, Missouri as follows,:

All male persons between the ages of Twenty-One and Fifty Years, who have resided within the corporate limits of the City of Hopkins, Missouri, Thirty days prior to the Passage of this act, are hereby required to work on the Streets and Alleys of said City, - Two-days for the year 1921, or in lieu thereof, to pay to the Street Commissioner of said City, the Sum of Two-Dollars, and if said work is not done at the time, and place at and for which notice is given by the Street Commissioner, said Two-Dollars shall immediately become due and payable, and suit shall be brought for the collection thereof, according to law, and the City Attorney shall be allowed a fee of Five-Dollars, (5) for bringing said suit, which fee shall be taxed as costs against the defendant in such suit against whom a judgment is rendered.

This Ordinance shall be in force and effect from and after its passage and approval.

Motion made and seconded, that this ordinance be read a second time,-- This motion prevailed, and it was read a second time.

Motion made and seconded, that this ordinance be read a Third time and placed upon its final passage, This motion prevailed and it was read a Third-time,:

City Treasurer Geo. D. Bowman, reports, that the Interest on outstanding City Water Bonds, fell due on May, 1st, and the same has been paid by him, for which he asks that there be issued in his favor a Warrant for the sum of \$300.75 on the Water Fund, When on motion made and seconded that his report be accepted, and the Clerk is hereby instructed to issue a warrant on the water Fund as follows.:

Due May, 1st 1921. War, No, (731) W.-F.- 300.75.

There being no further business Board did adjourn, subject to the pleasure of the Mayor.
