A Bill for an ordinance to devide the city of Hopkins into Oiling Districts, and providing for the issurance of Special Tax Bills in payment for the Oiling of the Streets and alleys thereof, -:

Be it ordained by the Board of Alderman of the City of Hopkins Missou -ri, as follows:-

Section 1. The City of Hopkins is hereby devided into-Four, (4) Oiling Districts to be Numbered Oiling Districts, -One, -Two, -Three, -and Four, as follows.

Oiling District No. One shall be composed of the following Streets and Alleys, viz,-

Rosbery Street from the East-side of Fourth Street to Railroad.

Third Street from Barnard Street to -One-Hundred and Twenty feet South of Rosebery Street.

Barnard Street from West-side of Fourth, to East-side of Seconed

Railroad Street from Rosebery to Warren Streets and all alleys

2.- Oiling District No.-Two. Shall consist of all the streets ans alleys in that portion of the city of Hopkins, lying south of the North-side of Rosebery Street and East of the East side of seconed street, except the streets and alleys included in District No_one.

3.- Oiling District No.-Three, shall consist of all the Streets an allyes in that portion of the City of Hopkins, lying North of Roseberry Street and East of the East side of Seconed Street, except the Streets and alleys included in District No,- one.

4 .- Oiling District No .- Four, shall consist of all the Streets and alleys lying West of the East side of Seconed Street.

Section, 2. The Board of Alderman of the City of Hopkins shall, by resolution, from time to time, as it deems expedient, in each year hereafter cause such portion of said Oiling District, as they deem expedient, to be ## Oiled, and the costs thereof shall be levied and paid as hereinafter provided, and provided that in no case shall the cost of such oiling, exceed Five Cents per front foot per month, upon the property abbutting upon the streetor allev or any part thereof so Oiled, and providing that the expence of oiling in each of said Districts shall be kept and charged separately.

Section, - 3. The above work shall be done by said City and an accurate account of the costs thereof, in each district, shall be kept by said city.

section, - 4. The costs of oiling said streets and alleys shall be provided for and defrayed by a Special tax to be assessed, in favor of the city, on the adjoining property fronting or bordering on the said streets where such oiling is done, in the proportion that the linear feet of each lot or pacel of ground fronting or bordering on the street so cilrd bears to the total number of linear feet of all property, chargable with the special tax, aforesaid, in the teritory embraced in the ciling district in which such ciling is done.

Section, 5. Within ten days after said oiling is done the Board of Aldermen, shall make the special assessments herein provided for, and the same shall be levied against the property liable therefor, and collected as a special tax and special tax bills shall issue therefor, which shall be known as special ass#essment for oil District No,-1. 2. 3. or 4. as the within ten days after said oiling is done the Board of

Evry such tax bill shall be and constitute a lien against the or parcel of ground described in the same, until the same is paid, n the said tax bills shall be made by the street commissioner, sighed by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk, dated the day of sate levey, and shall be payable in the following manner: Said tax bills shall be due and payable and it shall be the duty of the owner or owners of the property described in said tax bills to pay the amountnof said tax bills to the collector of the city of Hopkins within five-days after the date of issue, and if not so paid shall bear interest at the rate of 8% per cent paid shall hear interest at the rate of 8% per-cent per annum from the 1st day of Mav in each year in which such tax bills are issued, providing that in the year 1921 such tax bills shall bear interest at the rate of Eight.

(8) per-cent per annum from the date of issue if not paid when due as aforesaid,.

If such tax bills are not paid when due suit shall be brought by said city for the enforcement of such lien and the collection of such tax bill, according to law, in any court of competent jurisdiction.

Be it resolved by the Board of Aldermen of the City of Hopkins, as follows .-:

First,: That the Board of Aldermen shall cause the following Streets in ciling Distrist, No .- One. to be ciled, to-wit;

Roseberry Street from the East side of Fourth Street to Barnard Third Street from Barnard Street, to One-Hundred and Twenty, street, feet South of Roseberry Street. Barnard Street from West side of Fourth Street to East side of Second Street.

Second. The said Board of Alderman shall cause the following streets in oiling District No .- Two. to be oiled, to-wit:

Roseberry street to south side of Manuage Street, Manuage street from Third street to West side of Second Street, Second Street from Thempson Street.

Third, - The said Board of Aldermen, shall cause the following Streets in Oiling District No.-Three, to be oiled, to-wit,:

Barnard Street from Fourth Street, to Eight Street; and Fourth, Street from Roseberry to Warren Street.

Fourth,. The said Board of Aldermen, shall cause the following Streets in oiling district No.-Four, to be oiled, to-wit.:

Barnard street from East side of Second to West side of First street.

on motion made and seconed, that this resolution be andopted and approved as read, and the same be made a matter of record, This motion prevailed, and it was declared passed and approved by the Mayor this the 6th, day of June, 1921.
